I am a Registered Nurse and Public Health Nurse and it is my pleasure to be available to support the Kingsview Primary School community.

Public Health Nurses are available for discussion about a broad range of health related topics in relation to our Tamariki, we provide nursing support, advice, referral, and coordinated services for ages 0-18 years. We are available to listen and talk with parents and caregivers about their Tamariki/Children's health and wellbeing. We are also available for involvement in strengthening families and for health consultation. Our aim is to improve, promote and protect the health and wellbeing of children and young people and their family's whanau.

Including - healthy eating, exercise, oral health, continence, vision and hearing, immunisations, child development, mental health, sexual health. Support with ages and stages, behavioural and developmental challenges. Medical conditions, such as asthma, eczema, diabetes, allergies, anxiety, depression as examples.

Our service is free and confidential. It is complementary to any service provided by other health providers or by education and welfare sectors. We are available to meet with families in the environment that best meets their need, including home visits.

Fundraiser for Happiness House

Coronet Peak is once again selling wilding pines as Christmas trees to raise money for **Happiness House** over the holiday period.

For a \$20 minimum donation you can order a 'Happiness Tree' online and get it delivered to your door before Christmas. This year the trees will be available in two sizes – medium (between 90cm – 149cm) and large (between 150cm – 200cm+). The delivery dates are Sunday 8th or Sunday 15th December.

This will be the third year we have sold Happiness Trees for Christmas and are aiming to sell over 300 this time round. It's not only a great way to raise money for a good cause but also has a positive impact on our mountain environment by eliminating hundreds of wilding pines. It's been so successful we are having to visit neighbouring properties to find trees as we've removed most of them from Coronet Peak!
