- No U Turns are permitted on Yewlett Cres.

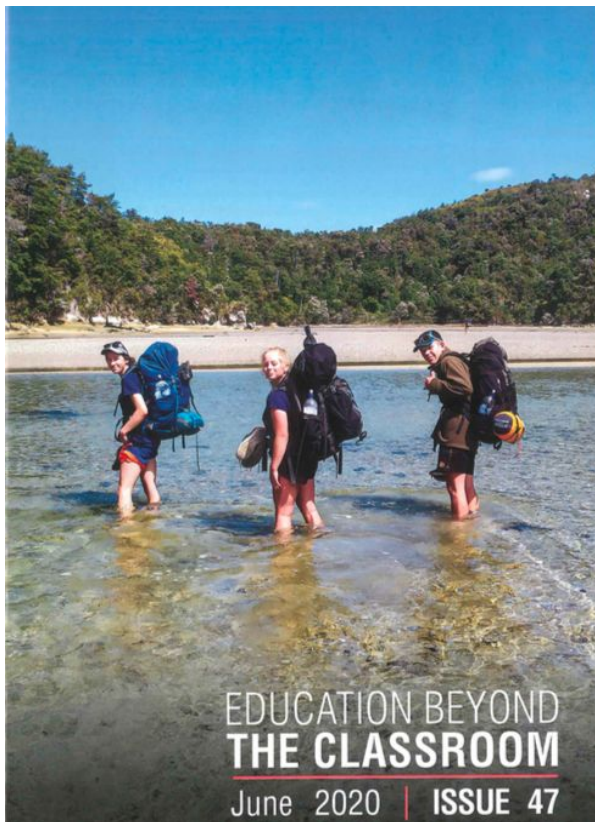
You can use the Frankton Tavern car park to park and walk up to pick your children up.

Camp Columba Kayaking

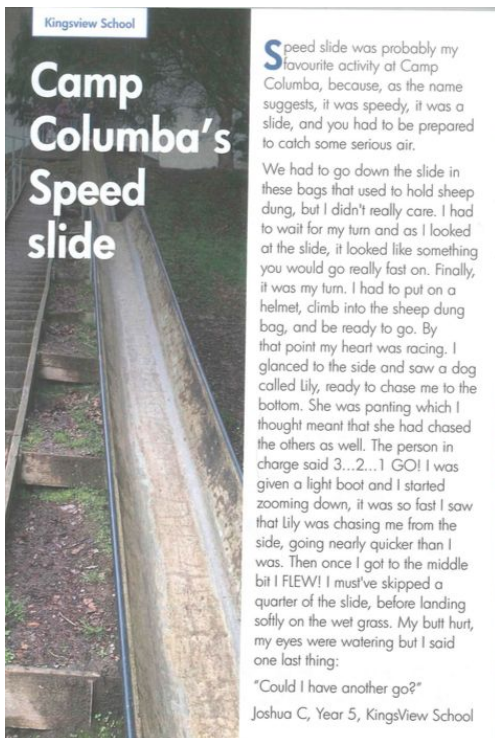

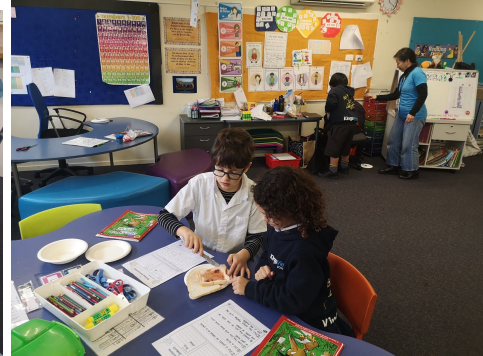
